LEGISLATION

Thanks to Kim Boatright, Court Services with the State of Missouri Office of State Courts Administrator, we received copies of the list of pre-filed bills in both the State House of Representatives and the State Senate.

Several pre-filed bills pertain to DWI and may be of interest to the MACA membership. They are:

SB 36 DWI FN 356-0

Westfall, Childers, Steelman, Bentley, Russell and Singleton. Among other changes, would tighten the standard for presuming driving while intoxicated by changing the blood alcohol standard from 0.1 to .08; change the ignition interlock law and allow for impoundment or immobilization; create a new penalty for "aggravated driving" offenders; restrict eligibility for a hardship license; increase the penalty where death or serious injury occurs as a result of careless and imprudent driving or when someone is the proximate cause of a motor vehicle accident while driving while intoxicated; restrict probation and parole for some DWIs; and increase the minimum time served before probation or parole is granted.

SB 81 FN 130-1

Goode. Would create the crime of "aggravated driving with excessive blood alcohol content" if such person's BAC is .15 or more.

HB 38 DWI/CAFA FN 468-1

Gaskill. Would extend to all cities the forfeiture provisions now applicable to Greene County; lower the BAC standard to .08 for vehicles and watercraft; extend the drivers' license suspension and revocation period for DWI offenders; create the crime of "vehicular homicide by an intoxicated person"; and prohibit an SIS or SES for certain alcohol-related municipal law violations.

SB 1 Miscellaneous Court Provisions FN 534-1

Schneider. This legislation has several items that will be of interest to Municipal Courts and should be reviewed. These include, removing traffic judges authority

to review certain Department of Revenue decisions; modify closed records provisions; eliminating civil trial de novo, except for small claims and require that any appeal be on the record.

SB 69 Stealing Offenses fn 519-2

Gross. Would increase the penalty for some stealing offenses, and lower the threshold for certain felony theft.

HB 182 Records Sealed FN 517-1

Thompson. Would provide for the partial sealing of some alcohol-related and other traffic conviction/plea records after an application to the court. Thereafter, information is denied to employers and insurers.

HB 90 Minimum Sentences FN 587-1

Ross. Would provide minimum jail sentences for driving without a license or driving while revoked.

On a national level, we would point out the following exert from the *Washington Update*, November 2000:

"Senator Gregg introduced S. 2554, the Amy Boyer's Law, which would bar the 'public display' or sale of any individual's SSN, electronically or in writing. The 'public display' language in the original bill included the dissemination of court records containing SSNs, which could cause substantial problems for some courts. After conversations with Senator Gregg's office, they agreed to the addition of language specifically exempting courts from these provisions. S. 2554 was subsequently attached to the Conference Committee Report on the CJS appropriations bill (H.R. 4690). However, there is strong opposition to any exemptions to the SSN prohibition. . . ."

This bill should be monitored to see what, if any, impact it will have on Courts in the state of Missouri.

VISION MEETING

On Friday, January 16, 2001, MACA Board Members who could attend held a meeting to discuss the Vision, Mission and Purpose of the Missouri Association for Court Administration. Those present reviewed the Purpose of the Association in the current by-laws; the mission statement in the new membership packets, the Trial Court Performance Standards, NACM's Ten Core Competencies Every Court Manager Should Know and Be Able To Do and some examples of vision and mission statements.

The Board in looking at the vision and mission statement is also asking the question: Are we accomplishing our mission? Are the Annual Conference, the New Clerk and Advanced Clerk Professional Development structured in such a way, covering topics and with speakers that accomplish our vision and mission?

Our old purpose statement is outdated and needs revision. The Mission Statement in the new membership packet reads as follows:

"It is the mission of the Missouri Association for Court Administration to enhance the public's trust and confidence in the Courts through developing and promoting the professionalism of Court Administrators and other court officials, with similar duties, by offering quality professional development conferences, seminars, consultation and networking."

The Court Performance Standards suggests that we be concerned about their five major areas:

- Access to Justice
- Expedition and Timeliness
- Equality, Fairness and Integrity
- Independence and Accountability
- Public Trust and Confidence

No one could argue that these five areas are not important to every court in the state of Missouri and perhaps these could be the themes of future Annual, New Clerks and Advanced Clerks Professional Development.

NACM's Ten Core Competencies of: Visioning and Strategic Planning; Caseload Management; Information Technology Management; Public Information and Media Relations; Employee Training and Development; Ancillary Services and Programs; Human Resource Management; Leadership; Resources, Budget and Finance and Purposes of Courts and Court Systems also lend themselves to topics that could be covered at our professional development opportunities. The State Justice Institute Grant provided us with a proposed way of accomplishing this.

It was suggested that if we have a clear vision and mission statement and incorporated the Court Performance Standards and NACM Core Competencies into our professional development opportunities that the professional development conferences would be of higher quality and that our membership would benefit from this. It would also benefit the Education Committee that has the responsibility to develop the theme and the speakers for all professional development.

It was the action of the Board to appoint a subcommittee to further develop a vision and mission statement and to present it to the Board for review at the March Board Meeting. The committee consists of Shara Meyer, Andrea Holland, Rick Thompson, Lisa Westfall and Larry Myers as Chairperson. It was also suggested that input from the Past Presidents of the Association would be of benefit.

Anyone wishing to have input into the activities of the committee or to just react to this please contact and make your input through any member of the committee.

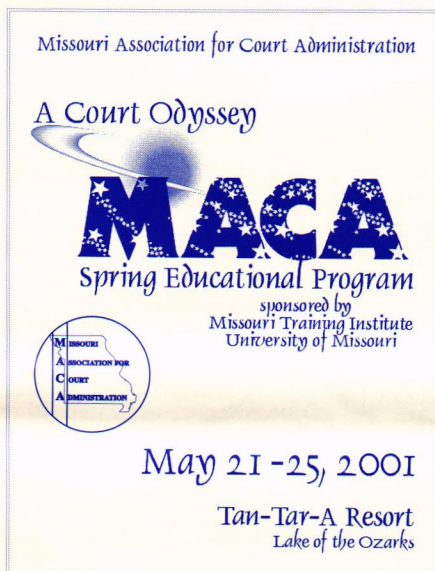

EDUCATION SUBCOMMITTEE UPDATE

On January 16, 2001 the Municipal Court Clerk Education Subcommittee "met" via a phone conference call to discuss Education and the Municipal Court Clerk in the year 2001. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the findings and recommendations made at the last Court Clerk Education Meeting.

As you may know, the Subcommittee was established to help plan educational opportunities for the Municipal Court Clerks with representatives of the Office of the State Court Administrators office (OSCA). Last year, the mother committee, the Court Clerk Education committee thought that it would be a good idea to move the Municipal Clerks in with the Circuit, Associate Circuit and Probate Clerks in the area of Education, rather than leave them with the Judges. For the first time, Municipal Court Clerks were invited to attend the Court Clerk College held in Jefferson City. If memory serves me right, about 40 Municipal Clerks attended the College held in October.

However, at the last Court Clerk Education meeting, the committee felt that they may not be meeting the needs of the Municipal Court Clerks with the Court Clerk College and therefore decided to go back to the Regional Legislative Updates that we have had in the past. Therefore, in addition to being invited to the Court Clerk College, Municipal Court Clerks will also be able to attend the Regional sessions with their Judges.

The dates for the Judges' session are September 28, 2001 in Cape Girardeau, October 5, 2001 in Springfield, October 12, 2001 in Columbia, October 19, 2001 in Kansas City, and finally November 2, 2001 in St. Louis. The Clerk sessions will be held at the same time.

The Municipal Court Clerk Education Subcommittee has scheduled a planning meeting for the Legislative Updates on May 21, 2001 at Tan-Tar-A prior to the kick-off of the Annual Conference. Please mark your calendars for the training session in your area and the Education Subcommittee will look forward to seeing each of you there.

JUVENILE TRAFFIC OFFENSES

The Office of State Courts Administrator (OSCA) has received several inquiries regarding the appropriate jurisdiction for juveniles with traffic offenses: the municipal or juvenile court. Chapter 211 addresses this issue. "The juvenile court shall **not** have jurisdiction over any child fifteen and one half years of age who is alleged to have violated a state or municipal ordinance or regulation as long as the violation does not constitute a felony, or state or municipal ordinance or regulation prohibiting possession or use of any tobacco product."

For example, a 16 year old may be arrested, fingerprinted, and photographed if charged with their first driving while intoxicated offense. The juvenile is not within the jurisdiction of the juvenile court because a first offense of driving while intoxicated is not a felony.

With the revision of 302.130 RSMo permitting a 15 year old to obtain a temporary driving permit, there have been concerns regarding jurisdiction over these juveniles until they turn 15 and a half. Chapter 211 has not changed, it still states that the municipal court will have jurisdiction only when the juvenile is 15 and a half. Therefore, a 15 year old would be under the jurisdiction of the juvenile court.

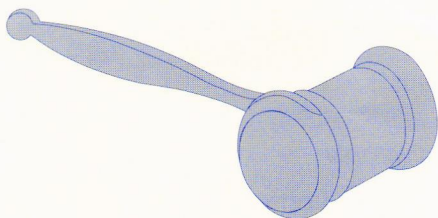

ANSWERING THE AUDITORS

At the Court Clerk College this fall a number of questions were asked concerning the visits by the state auditor's office. One of the issues in question was the auditor's habit of indicating the accounting of ticket numbers (ticket inventory) in the clerk's audit. As we all know, this responsibility lies with the police chief. Shara Meyer of Columbia Municipal Court submitted the following as her "pat" answer to the auditors regarding this issue:

"The request to properly account of the numerical sequence of tickets has been made to the police department(s). However, the court has no control over the police department(s). Since tickets may be voided, filed as state charges, or nolle prossed by the city prosecutor, there are valid reasons why the ticket may not reach the Municipal Court Clerk.

Chapter 300, RSMo 1986, "Model Traffic Ordinance" provides in Section 300.575.3, RSMo 1986, that the responsibility for accounting for ticket books and citations rests with the police chief:

'The chief of police shall be responsible for the issuance of such books to individual members of the police department. The chief of police shall require a written receipt for every book so issued and shall maintain a record of every such book and each set of citations contained therein.'

Shara thought other Court Administrators might want to keep this filed in their audit file, available for when the auditors come to visit.

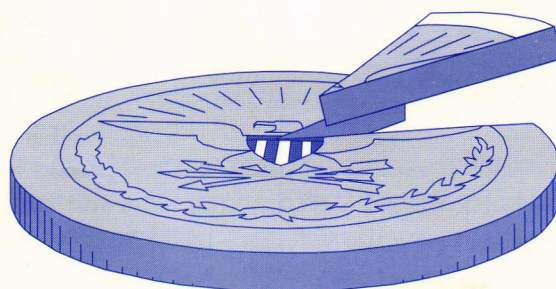
