## Municipal Legislation

All Legislation is Effective  
August 28, 2003, unless otherwise stated

2003 Update

### PROCEDURE

#### DISPOSITION REPORTING

##### **Section 577.051 RSMo, House Bill 470, 613 & Senate Bill 468**

Clarifies that dispositions (previously final dispositions) in any court proceeding involving any violations of any of the provisions of Sections 577.005 to 577.023 RSMo. (DWI/BAC) or violations of county or municipal ordinances involving alcohol - or drug-related driving offenses should be forwarded to the Missouri State Highway Patrol or the Department of Revenue.

Clarifies that the following dispositions are reportable:

- \* including pleas of guilty
- \* findings of guilty
- \* suspended imposition of sentence
- \* suspended execution of sentence
- \* probation
- \* conditional sentences
- \* sentences of confinement
- \* other such dispositions that may require under state or federal regulations.

##### **Clerk Impact:**

The change does not impact the dispositions to be reported by the courts. The word "final" was removed because several of the dispositions that are required to be reported are not final dispositions.

*Found in Municipal Clerk Manual Section 1.3. Reporting Requirements and 3.2 Traffic Disposition Reporting.*

#### ACCESS TO CRIMINAL RECORDS

##### **Section 610.120 RSMo, Senate Bill 184**

This provision clarifies which **criminal justice agencies are authorized access to criminal records that have been closed** pursuant to Section 610.105 RSMo and **expands the circumstances when confidential records can be accessed.** Currently, the courts, law enforcement agencies, the Department of Revenue and certain administrative agencies are authorized to access closed records for specific circumstances in the performance of their duties.

In addition, confidential records shall be available to:

- \* Criminal justice agencies screening applicants for employment and/or screening individuals with access to criminal justice facilities and procedures, and sensitive information;

- \* Law enforcement agencies for issuance or renewal of licenses, permits, certifications or registrations for positions such as, but not limited to: watchmen, security personnel, private investigators and individuals seeking permits to purchase fire arms.

A criminal justice agency receiving a request for criminal history information under their control may request verification of the identity (including fingerprints) before releasing the confidential records.

*Found in Municipal Clerk Manual Section 5.1, Closed Records Under Chapter 610 RSMo.*

### COST

#### WITNESS FEES AND MILEAGE

##### **Section 491.280 RSMo, House Bill 613**

Witnesses (in county/out of county) shall be allowed fees for their services in the amount of **twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per day plus a mileage allowance** as provided in Section 33.095 RSMo. **The mileage rate for FY 2004 is thirty-three cents (.33).** Annually, at the beginning of the fiscal year, OSCA sends the standard mileage rate to the appointing authorities.

**The out-of-state witness fee did not change.**

*Found in Municipal Clerk Manual Section 2.6, Witness/Subpoena.*

#### Inmate Security Fund Surcharge

##### **Section 488.5026 RSMo, Senate Bill 5**

Provides that upon approval by a governing body of a city, county, or city not within a county, **a new surcharge of two dollars (\$2.00) shall be assessed as court costs in each court proceeding filed in any court in any city, county, or city not within a county adopting the surcharge.** The surcharge is to be **collected as court costs in all criminal cases including surcharge. The surcharge is to be collected as court costs in all criminal cases including violations of county ordinances, criminal or traffic laws, infractions, municipal ordinances, and in juvenile court proceedings involving any child who is alleged to have violated a state law or municipal ordinance prior to attaining the age of seventeen (17) years, except those involving any child fifteen and one-half (15 1/2) years of age who is alleged to have violated a state or municipal traffic ordinance or regulation, the violation of which does not constitute a felony, or any child who is alleged to have violated a state or municipal ordinance or regulation prohibiting possession or use of any tobacco product.**

The surcharge shall not be assessed when costs are to be paid by the state, county or municipality, or when a criminal proceeding or defendant has been dismissed by the court.

**NOTE: The County will need to pass an ordinance for the court to collect the two dollars (\$2.00) Inmate Security Fund surcharge.**

Disburse to the County Treasurer for deposit to the "Inmate Security Fund." Funds are to be used to develop biometric identification systems to track prisoners in local jails.

*Found in Municipal Clerk Manual Section 4.1. Municipal Court Costs.*

## INCOME TAX OFFSET PROGRAM

*EMERGENCY CLAUSE EFFECTIVE 7/1/03*

### **Sections 143.782 and 488.5028 RSMo, House Bill 600**

These provisions will allow the courts, through OSCA, to participate in the state's income tax refund offset program to secure payment of unpaid fines, fees, costs or other sums owed to the state or one of its political subdivisions. (Restitution owed to victims will not be reported to the DOR as a delinquent court debt). In accordance with statute, OSCA is currently working with a group of judges, clerks, and representatives of the Department of Revenue to write the procedures and create the necessary data exchanges. It is anticipated that a pilot program will be operational in the state courts by the start of the 2004 tax year.

#### **Clerk Impact:**

The Department of Revenue requires the information to be transmitted electronically. Therefore, this program is only available to state and municipal courts that have an IT staff who can provide an electronic file to OSCA with required information.

The debt offset can only be done if the total delinquent amount for a payment plan is twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) or more, the payment plan is for costs and fines only (OSCA can subtract restitution from the payment plan total), and contains all the required party information. There will be a process to appeal any income tax offset collected.

To participate in the program, the court must have a SSN and Last Name. Debt offset can only be applied to individual tax returns not business tax returns.

## COLLECTION AGENCIES

*EMERGENCY CLAUSE EFFECTIVE 7/1/03*

### **Section 488.5030 RSMo, House Bill 600**

This provision allows courts to turn over outstanding debt (including restitution) to public or private collections agencies and to add the cost of collection, not to exceed twenty percent (20%) of amount collected, to the amount owed. OSCA will be submitting a statewide request for proposal (RFP) for these services. However, this does not prevent the courts from requesting their own bids.

**NOTE:** It is recommended that any local contract with a collection agency should *not* provide for exclusive collection of debt.

## COURT INFORMATION AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT FEE - KANSAS CITY

### **Section 488.2220 RSMo, House Bill 599**

Allows Kansas City to charge additional court costs up to five dollars (\$5.00) per case for municipal ordinance violations filed in the municipal and associate divisions of the court to be used for the procurement, installation, maintenance, consulting services, and upkeep of a court information and records management system.

## STATE OF MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Representatives from the Department of Revenue and Office of State Courts Administrator recently attended the annual Missouri Association of Court Administration seminar. One of the many topics discussed, was the revised changes to the Uniform Traffic Ticket (UTT) / Record of Conviction (ROC). In particular, the section referring to "MANDATORY INSURANCE." The new verbiage added to the (UTT) and (ROC) is as follows:

Order of Supervision     Order of Suspension  
DO NOT ASSESS POINTS    ASSESS POINTS    YES    NO

**BASED ON CURRENT MISSOURI STATE STATUTE, ONLY STATE COURTS CAN UTILIZE THE ORDER OF SUPERVISION / SUSPENSION.** Therefore the change to the (UTT) and (ROC) does not affect the Municipal Courts at this time. If a Municipal Court has a citizen that is convicted of "Failure to Show Proof of Insurance", the court would be required to send in the moving traffic violation to the Department of Revenue to process and add the four points to the driving record.

If you are a State Court, you have two additional options to use when hearing traffic violations for failure to show proof of insurance - Order of Supervision and Order of Suspension. See explanation below for proper processing of the traffic ticket.

### ORDER OF SUPERVISION

- If the court wants to issue an Order of Supervision AND assess points, the clerk would complete the Mandatory Insurance - Order of Supervision / Suspension form AND send in the ticket WITHOUT checking the "Order of Supervision" box.

- If the court wants to issue an Order of Supervision and NOT assess points, the clerk would complete the Mandatory Insurance - Order of Supervision / Suspension form AND check the "Order of Supervision" box on the ticket.

### ORDER OF SUSPENSION

- If the court wants to issue an Order of Suspension AND assess points, the clerk would complete the Mandatory Insurance - Order of Supervision / Suspension form AND

send in the ticket with the "Order of Suspension" box marked AND the "YES" box marked.

- If the court wants to issue an Order of Suspension and NOT assess points, the clerk would complete the Mandatory Insurance - Order of Supervision / Suspension form AND send in the ticket with the "Order of Suspension" box marked AND the "NO" box marked.

It has been brought to the attention of the Driver and Vehicles Services Bureau that the NONRESIDENT VIOLATOR COMPACT (NRVC) form (2283) with a revised date of (3-03) needs to be recalled. The form was mistakenly printed without the notification of compliance. The form was printed with all 4 plies being the same document. Please, if you have a supply of NRVC form 2283 with a revised date of 3-03, destroy them immediately. The Missouri State Printing Center is in the process of reprinting the form correctly. 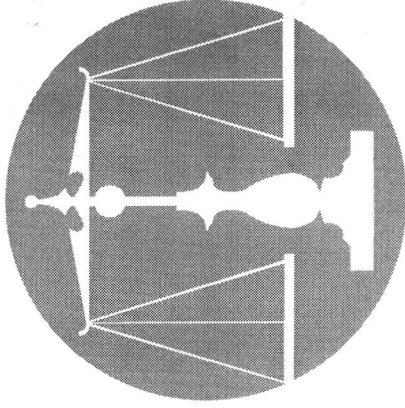

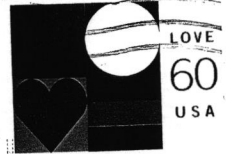
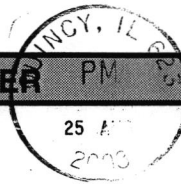
